In Memory of....



While visiting Rhinebeck a couple weeks ago, Bonnie and learned of a 9/11 memorial in the neighboring town of Stanfordville Stanfordville is about 15 miles east of Rhinebeck so we took a ride over.

This 911 Memorial was created in honor of the 2,978 people that lost their lives that fateful day, SEPTEMBER 11th 2001

343 RED FIREFIGHTER FLAGS, 71 BLUE LAW ENFORCEMENT FLAGS and 2564 AMERICAN FLAGS are used to depict the TWIN TOWERS and the surrounding area. Each flag represents a firefighter, police officer or civilian killed that day.

Also lost that day and often under-recognized are the 10 unborn children portrayed by 10 smaller AMERICAN FLAGS attached to larger AMERICAN FLAGS and the PORT AUTHORITY K 9, "SIRUS", represented by his own unique FLAG.





There we found a display of flags memorializing all the deceased victims of the 9/11 tragedy. There were 343 red firefighter flags, 71 blue law enforcement flags, 2564 American flags representing the fallen civilians, 10 of which had smaller American flags attached to them representing the unborn children who also perished, and a special "dog" flag for the one lost Port Authority canine. The flags were displayed on the

grassy hill in front

of the town hall. Included in the display was the uniform of one of Stanfordville's own fallen fire fighters. This was a beautiful, but somber, display, and a wonderful tribute to those that lost their lives that day.
